Dear Friends and Colleagues…

The decision to move the World Sanskrit Conference online was a difficult one, but we would like to thank you all for your continuing support and commitment. I doubt there is anyone more disappointed than the members of our local organising committee, and your messages of understanding and encouragement have been gratefully received.

Nearly everyone who responded to the survey we conducted some months ago indicated that they would of course prefer to attend in person, but in view of the continuing uncertainty it was impossible for them (and indeed for us) to make any definite plans.

Having decided to go online, we are now determined to make this conference as valuable, informative, stimulating and collegial as possible. We will be offering you a great variety of structured and formal events, panel workshops, learned discussions with many opportunities for informal catch-up sessions and meeting spaces as we can. Of course, we include the perennially popular *Kavi-samavāya* and Scholars' Debate Śāstra-cacār, and cultural events.

Planning for Global Communication...

An online conference requires a different approach. Before the conference, participants will upload their full papers, audio or video presentation to the WSC website. The WSC community of scholars will then have over a month to read, watch or listen to relevant papers before the conference.

When the conference begins on 9 January, colleagues will convene in virtual panel sessions for what we hope will be lively Q&A workshops with authors. We have participants in almost every time zone. Each live activity or workshop will be held twice, an 'early session' and a 'late session'. This will ensure that all events are accessible to all participants within reasonable working hours.

Retaining or Updating your Abstract…

If the abstract you originally submitted was accepted by the Section coordinators, you will soon receive an email from the WSC secretariat giving you the following options:

- 1. continue with the abstract as is
- 2. make minor revisions to the abstract
- 3. submit a new abstract
- 4. withdraw the abstract entirely







If your original abstract was not accepted, please do not submit it again. You may however submit a revised abstract.

Please note that the portal **will not reopen** for the Computational Sanskrit and Digital Humanities section. Contributions to this section have already been finalised.
